## Tigers in Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve 2007

Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve national park has highest density of tigers approx more than 54 tigers are estimated in the park. However, the parks has huge quantity of other mammals, including sambar deers, spotted deer, wild dog, hyena, leopard, and black faced Langure. The park also has numerous ancient caves, rock shelters and building structure of more than 2000 years old. Due to huge availability of herbivorous, it is most suitable center of tigers.

B-2, an, eleven years old male tiger is called king of this Park. He is big, majestic and unperturbed about vehicle or elephant so he is a focal point for all tourists and can be seen or encountered any where in the parks like a lord. Bonka (a front teeth chipped off tiger) is about 7 years old male tiger and has established it's territory in the southern area of the park. However, he is now penetrating in to the territory of B-2 and its encroachment is succeeded.

All the sub adults (chakradhara & sidhbaba) cubs are pushed off by B-2 to bamera dam & thodi area respectively. The vanbaye female also had small 3 cubs now will be about 3 -4 months, Jhurjura female cubs are also have 2 small cubs, and Mahaman female have one year old 4 cubs, and Sukhi patia have one year old 3 cubs.
