TRANSLOCATION OF 19 GAURS

19 gaurs, 'Indian Bison', sifted from Kanha to Bandhavgarh

Long awaited dream of translocation work of Indian Bison endangered animals has been completed on 31 Jan 2011 by shifting 19 gaurs from Kanha to Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve. There was no Gaurs left at Bandhavgarh since 1990

The MoEF had sanctioned its initial permission in the year 2007. Three State IFS officers, one veterinary expert and one veterinary expert from WII were trained in South Africa for catching and transporting gaur. An enclosure was also prepared for keeping these animals in **Bandhavgarh**. South Africa had donated for vehicles, especially designed for the purpose. The Forest Department had procured the medicines and equipment to be used in the project

from South Africa. The translocation operation coverage right was to a foreign based firm '& Beyond', previously known as CC Africa. The entire operation completed from 17 Jan to 31 Jan 2011.

Territorial fight, tigress killed another tigress

07th March, 2011 Bandhavgarh is a compact Tiger Reserve. Density of tigers is more. So, there are often cases of tiger fight over territorial fighting. In a recent case, tigress Chorbhehra Langdi a 6 years old tigress was killed by Kankati, 4 years old tigress and her body was eaten up leaving head in carcass. The Chorbhehra Langdi tigress was mother of two cubs. This has happened in Tala Range of Bandhavgarh which is known as core area for tiger sighting famous for having more tigers. In fight, Kankati had also sustained injuries in her eyes.
